# Policy Text

# Qualifying Criteria (1)

- 200 - too many?
  - “have a **plan** for making at least 200 /48 assignments to other organisations within two years”

# Qualifying Criteria (2)

- Routing in Address Policy?
  - “plan to provide IPv6 connectivity to organisations to which it will assign /48s by **advertising that connectivity through its single aggregated address allocation**”
  - What about private (closed) networks?



# Registration Requirements (1)

- Do /48 assignments have to be registered in whois?
  - “When an organisation holding an IPv6 address allocation makes IPv6 address assignments, it must register assignment information in a database, **accessible by RIRs** “



# Registration Requirements (2)

- “(Information registered by an RIR/NIR may be replaced by a distributed database for registering address management information in future)”



# Registration Requirements (3)

- “Information is registered in units of assigned /48 networks. When **more than a /48** is assigned to an organisation, the assigning organisation is responsible for ensuring that the address space is **registered in an RIR/NIR database**”

# Allocation size

- “Organisations may qualify for an initial allocation greater than /32 by submitting documentation that **reasonably justifies** the request.”
